Canons of Dort-3&4HoD: Articles 12-13 - The Wonder of Your Conversion

Beloved in the Lord: The writers of the Canons <u>couldn't help but stop and wonder at the</u> <u>wonder of salvation!</u>

They saw <u>hopelessly depraved sinners</u> (who did not know or want to know God), <u>unconditionally elected by the Father</u>, <u>given a Savior – Jesus Christ</u>, <u>pulled to God by his Holy Spirit</u>, and then <u>saved for eternity</u>.

Why would the writers not stop and praise God? They had to. They did. This is what we will examine today. You will see the miracle of conversion under two headings:

Conversion is a Supernatural Work Conversion is an Incomprehensible Work

Our goals are: That you will see your conversion was totally outside your abilities or desire, that you will rejoice in your conversion, and that you will then labor for the conversion of others.

Conversion is a Supernatural Work

Article 12: Regeneration a Supernatural Work - And this is the regeneration, the new creation, the raising from the dead, and the making alive so clearly proclaimed in the Scriptures, which God works in us without our help. But this certainly does not happen only by outward teaching, by moral persuasion, or by such a way of working that, after God has done the divine work, it remains in our power whether or not to be reborn or converted. Rather, it is an entirely supernatural work, one that is at the same time most powerful and most pleasing, a marvelous, hidden, and inexpressible work, which is not less than or inferior in power to that of creation or of raising the dead, as Scripture (inspired by the author of this work) teaches. As a result, all those in whose hearts God works in this marvelous way are certainly, unfailingly, and effectively reborn and do actually believe. And then the will, now renewed, is not only activated and motivated by God, but in being activated by God is also itself active. For this reason, human beings themselves, by that grace which they have received, are also rightly said to believe and to repent.

1. Conversion is wonderfully supernatural.

a. *Conversion is a kind of resurrection*. Physical or supernatural resurrection is a supernatural act. The dead is raised to life.

<u>John 5: 25</u> "Most assuredly, I say to you, the hour is coming, and now is, when <u>the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God; and those</u> who hear will live.

There are many non-believers raised to life every single day! You were one of them. *Isn't that wonderful*?

b. *Conversion is a kind of re-creation*. Creation is a supernatural act – to make something out of nothing.

Who can imagine what it was like for there to be nothing and then there was everything? Creation happened "out of nothing!" Man wasn't there! But God made him!

No one resisted God in creation and not one can resist God in regeneration (recreation)!

<u>Ephesians 2: 10</u> For we are His workmanship, <u>created in Christ Jesus</u> for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.

If you could have resisted conversion, you would have! Thank God you couldn't resist him. God calls man supernaturally, as he called Lazarus from the dead. Lazarus heard and responded. *Isn't your re-creation wonderful*?

c. This *does not mean all conversions happen in a dramatic way.* "Drama" is not the aspect of resurrection or creation that is being compared to conversion.

Rather, God was comparing the wonder of resurrection and the wonder of creation. God was showing your passivity (not drama) in your creation and resurrection.

2. Trouble comes when those who do have a notable conversion think that is the only way one is saved.

They may think those who were raised in the faith and quietly embrace Christ (without the drama) as a result of being taught from their youth, are somehow lesser Christians or are not Christians at all!

But don't feel pressured to come up with a date and time of your conversion. If you know one, fine. If you don't, that's okay too. Don't feel guilty if you did not have a dramatic conversion experience.

I came to realization of my sin one day while standing under a tree waiting for my friends. I realized I was not living a good life and needed to look to the Lord. There were no outward tears. I didn't raise my hand or walk down an aisle in church. Life slowly began to change.

Most people come to **believe through a long process of time...just like a pregnancy**.

Conversion is <u>a dramatic internal work</u> – but may <u>not be dramatic outwardly</u>. <u>Conversion may not be filled with tears as some who are converted</u>.

<u>John 3:5</u> Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God.

Nicodemus, the one the Lord was addressing, had to come to terms that to be saved there was nothing he could do, but to receive what God offered. **He was passive**. He had no part in his birth.

While Nicodemus DID NOT HAVE TO DO ANYTHING to be saved, he had to KNOW he was born again! How would he know it? He would know it in his heart and he would show it by his fruits.

A tree is declared good by its fruits. If there were not fruits, it wouldn't matter how green the tree looked, would it?

So if you trust in Jesus Christ, if you feel shame when you sin...if you feel the urge to confess your sins ...if you want to talk to God...if you want to listen to God...if you want to be with God's people to worship him...then that is evidence of conversion.

Join the church!

3. This supernatural work is "most powerful, most pleasing, marvelous, hidden, and inexpressible," whether it is done at one time or over a long period of time.

God shatters man's pride and makes him aware of his wretchedness!

- 4. Once this supernatural act occurs, the sinner is unfailingly and effectively reborn, never to die again.
- 5. Arminians reject the fact that their wills need to be reborn.

 They believe their wills are intact and they can choose and come to God without

<u>his help.</u> In fact, they believe their repentance saves them. But <u>they only repent</u> <u>because they have been given new life first!</u>

This error caused **significant weakening of the church** in Scotland.

(<u>Because Arminians think they have a sound will, they emphasize the</u>

<u>persuasiveness of the preacher</u> – with much yelling, screaming, crying, and lots of great stories! They believe the preacher can move man's will!)

How unfair to the preacher! How dishonoring to Christ.

Arminians forget Jesus was the best preacher of all and most who heard him rejected him! Because the Arminians hold to this erroneous view, they effectively rob God of praise for this supernatural work.

Who wants to rob God?

6. Your response:

a. As a Christian, knowing your conversion was so supernatural, be impressed and praise God more.

You were wretches with no will to do good. Then you were saved - in a most incredible way.

No one gets depressed knowing he was rescued from a most hopeless condition and then established as a royal priest.

So Rejoice! A normal man would be full of joy and would praise his rescuer – and offer his rescuer his life!

At the very <u>least</u> he would want to serve his rescuer!

- b. Help the Arminian see he is robbing God of the praise that belongs to him when he argues that he does not need God's help to come to God!
- c. Because conversion is a supernatural work of God, you know the world doesn't need morals...it needs a resurrection in the soul.

Help them see the light. Morality comes with a change of heart!

d. Because conversion is a supernatural work of God, you know the world does

not need perfect laws to be saved...the world needs the perfect work of Jesus. Help them see the light.

Conversion is an Incomprehensible Work

Article 13: The Incomprehensible Way of Regeneration - In this life believers cannot fully understand the way this work occurs; meanwhile, they rest content with knowing and experiencing that, by this grace of God, they do believe with the heart and love their Savior.

1. Conversion happens in such a way that you cannot fully understand it - just like creation was incomprehensible, and just like resurrection is incomprehensible.

The Spirit of God, like the wind at creation, blows wherever he wills. <u>You know you are converted</u> because the <u>Bible says so</u> and <u>God's Holy Spirit works in you to believe it</u>.

For example, I am technologically deficient. So I might ask Kevin or Karthik how my computer runs and they might know and explain it to me, but I likely won't understand their explanations. Because I know and trust them based on past experiences, I would believe what they say.

Similarly, trust **God's Word and work** in you!

2. Arminians argue, since God must pull man to himself, men must then come kicking and screaming to God.

But we don't believe, and the Bible doesn't teach, man comes kicking and screaming against God's will.

<u>Conversion does not happen against the will of the Christian.</u> God works in man's heart in such a way man desires to come.

Hear Jesus: The one whom God chose and works in, will willingly come!

John 6:37 "All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will by no means cast out.

3. Your response:

a. Rest in contentment even though conversion is incomprehensible to you.

Rest in contentment as a sinner, the Savior loved you and died for you.

Rest in contentment you will be with him in glory on the last day.

Rest in contentment he will give you everything you need to wait for that time.

Isaiah 55:9 "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, So are My ways higher than your ways, And My thoughts than your thoughts.

10 "For as the rain comes down, and the snow from heaven, And do not return there, But water the earth, And make it bring forth and bud, That it may give seed to the sower And bread to the eater, 11 So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, But it shall accomplish what I please, And it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it. 12 "For you shall go out with joy, And be led out with peace; The mountains and the hills Shall break forth into singing before you, And all the trees of the field shall clap their hands.

<u>Isaiah does not try to explain the unexplainable</u>; he wanted you to <u>accept it, enjoy</u> <u>it, and respond to it</u>.

b. Love and serve God for converting you in this incomprehensible way.

Conclusion:

You were converted by the work of God alone. He pulled you to himself by his Holy Spirit. He worked through his Holy Spirit through his Word to create faith. Through faith you received what Christ did.

This work of conversion was a supernatural work and beyond comprehension! It was done apart from any human intervention.

Brothers and Sisters in Jesus Christ:

1. Thank God you have experienced this most powerful, most pleasing, most marvelous, and most inexpressible conversion through Jesus Christ.

It is not important to know the date and time of your rebirth, but you need to know that you *ARE* reborn. God gave you a gift that you could never get by yourself, a gift that was *most critical to your eternity*, and it was a gift you did not even know you needed.

So, yes, yell it out to the world: "I'm saved, and I know that I am."

Come adorned with the finest praises of God.



- **2.** Teach your children about the wonder of salvation so they too will believe and praise the Lord.
- 3. And because rebirth is necessary for life and it gives praise to God, yell out this message to the world.

Finally, if you are not a Christian, be clear about this: No Christ, no conversion. But if you say today: "Lord, I want you to work supernaturally and save me because Jesus took the punishment for me," he will give you everything you need and more.
