

Heidelberg Catechism 116 – Why Do You Need To Pray?

Brothers and Sisters in Jesus Christ: Reformed people, who have the fullest knowledge of the love, power, and work of God, should be the most faithful people in prayer, but often, we are not. One reason we are not faithful in prayer might be because we are arrogant on account of our doctrines being superior to other churches. Another reason we might not be faithful in prayer is because we think that since God is sovereign and will do his will and do whatever is good for us, we don't need to pray as much. Maybe there are other reasons. Whatever the reason, we don't pray as much and as consistently as we should. But the Scriptures insist by command and by necessity that Christians must pray. You will hear from God concerning this.

Our headings are:

Prayer is required as Thankfulness.

Prayer is required for Things you need

Our goals are: That having seen the definite need for consistent prayer, you will pray for yourself and others to receive the help you need so that you can be effective covenant children of Christ.

116 Q. WHY DO CHRISTIANS NEED TO PRAY? A. Because prayer is the most important part of the thankfulness God requires of us. And also because God gives his grace and Holy Spirit only to those who pray continually and groan inwardly, asking God for these gifts and thanking him for them.

Prayer is Required Thankfulness

1. What is prayer? Prayer is a command to talk to God through the merits of his Son Jesus Christ.

Philippians 4: 6 Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God;

There are 2 main reasons you pray.

2. You pray to show you are thankful to God for all the good things that Jesus Christ has done for you.

Psalm 50: 14 Offer to God thanksgiving, And pay your vows to the Most High.

5 Call upon Me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify Me."

Do you really get this? When you pray and ask God for "stuff" you are showing you are thankful to him. Your prayer shows you recognize that God redeemed you, that he is your Lord, and that you are his child. This is rather difficult to fathom, because when someone asks you for something, you are not always interested in helping and recognize it as an imposition. But hear God's Words:

Psalm 116: 12 What shall I render to the LORD For all His benefits toward me?

13 I will take up the cup of salvation, And call upon the name of the LORD. 14 I

will pay my vows to the LORD Now in the presence of all His people. 15 Precious in the sight of the LORD Is the death of His saints. 16 O LORD, truly I am Your servant; I am Your servant, the son of Your maidservant; You have loosed my bonds. 17 I will offer to You the sacrifice of thanksgiving, And **will call upon the name of the LORD.**

So how do you show your thankfulness, you ask for more! Imagine that! That's how God wanted it!

Psalm 50: 16 As for me, I will call upon God, And the LORD shall save me. 17 Evening and morning and at noon I will pray, and cry aloud, And He shall hear my voice. 18 He has redeemed my soul in peace from the battle that was against me, For there were many against me.

3. The world thinks success in life depends on man's skills and smart's – his higher education, his position in society, etc., so the “scientific” world rejects the idea of praying to a God that is much bigger than we. But you know better. The Christian depends on Christ for good. God is your great benefactor.

4. Sadly, it is also the tendency of some “Christians,” as they are influenced by the Devil, to think too much of their own abilities, and minimize prayer (极度轻视祷告). They have little sense of what the Lord has done for them. Some of these “Christians” are often “conformity” Christians (走形式的基督徒). They simply see what other Christians do and they do the same. They don't have a personal relationship with Christ – a personal experience. They pray, but it is out of routine...without any thinking. They rattle off a form prayer without hesitation, but without hope.

Prayer is Requisite for Things You Need

1. You must also pray in order that God would supply yours and your neighbor's needs. Consider some examples:

a. You need sustenance (营养供应) for body and soul. You need food, clothing, and shelter. You need friends and family. You need the fellowship of believers.

Psalm 145: 8 The LORD is near to all who call upon Him, To all who call upon Him in truth. 19 He will fulfill the desire of those who fear Him; **He also will hear their cry and save them.**

b. You need God's Holy Spirit; he is most critical to your existence and sanctification

Psalm 51:11 Do not cast me away from Your presence, And do not take Your Holy Spirit from me. (不要丢弃我, 使我离开你的面; 不要从我收回你的圣灵。)

You want God's Holy Spirit to come into you more and more. But here is a question to ponder (思考)! How can God give his Holy Spirit through prayer, and yet you cannot pray to God without the help of the Holy Spirit? Seems like a chicken and the egg scenario. The answer is easy! God's Holy Spirit must quicken you first so that you would believe and put your trust in Christ. This catechism question was not referring to the initial act of conversion (转变, 皈依), but the subsequent acts of growing in grace. Even though you already have God's Holy Spirit, you need to pray for his reformatinal work in your life. We even use the phrase “be filled with the

Spirit of God.”（被神的灵充满） This means you become more and more confirmed to the image of Christ (you are sanctified 被圣化 and you serve better) as the Holy Spirit works in you.

Romans 8: 26 Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. 27 Now He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He makes intercession for the saints according to the will of God. （26 况且我们的软弱有圣灵帮助，我们本不晓得当怎样祷告，只是圣灵亲自用说不出的叹息，替我们祷告。27 鉴察人心的，晓得圣灵的意思；因为圣灵照着神的旨意替圣徒祈求。）

c. You need the destruction of your enemies, people who daily harass（扰乱，折磨） the souls of God’s people. Consider the Lord’s rhetorical question（诘问，反问） to his hearers?

Luke 18: 7 "And **shall God not avenge His own elect who cry out day and night to Him, though He bears long with them?** 8 "I tell you that He will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will He really find faith on the earth?"（7 神的选民，昼夜呼吁他，他纵然为他们忍了多时，岂不终久给他们伸冤吗？8 我告诉你们，要快地给他们伸冤了；然而人子来的时候，遇得见世上有信德吗？）

When you pray for the destruction of Christ’s enemies and the enemies of his church, he blesses you. It shows you understand God’s holiness and you want to preserve it. You may not pray for judgment upon your personal enemies. By the way, do you see how we fail in our duties when we avoid singing of judgment on God’s enemies? How can God keep you safe when the enemy is out to steal, kill, and destroy? Did not Jesus come to destroy the Devil and bind him? Should you not pray that God would confound the work and the wealth of the wicked...wealth that they use against you.

And since you deserve none of these 3 things, they are properly called “graces.” Pray for graces!

2. Let me address the false notion that “prayer changes things” before moving on. Prayer changes nothing. Prayer is not the source of grace. God changes things through your prayer.（神透过你的祷告来改变事情。） Why is this important? This distinction is important because many people look at prayer as superstition（迷信）. They believe if they mime（模仿） a specific prayer a few times that it would bring a magical answer. Roman Catholics are notorious（声名狼藉的） for repetitive prayer. Pentecostals（灵恩派） are worse than Roman Catholics in this. They have a phrase that they repeat over and over again like Hare Krishna’s（国际黑天觉悟会）， expecting to get better results. The effective fervent pray of a righteous man moves God...to act...to save...to destroy. It is the object – the one who answers your prayer- that matters. Your prayer must have direction.

3. What about those who argue then that you don’t need to pray because God knows what you need before you ask? Or maybe they just have a quick token prayer. Answer: God does not need to know what you need by your prayers. He knows everything. But you need to ask God for what you need. In other words, God doesn’t need prayer. You need prayer.

4. Since you always need things, you must pray consistently and persistently（坚持不懈地）. Remember how Daniel prayed regularly? He stood up to the Babylonian establishment and

publicly prayed as was his custom in Judah. Nothing made him change. Prayer was like breathing to him. (对于他, 祷告就象呼吸一样。) And he regularly did it. Prayer is your spiritual breath.

Daniel 6:10 Now when Daniel knew that the writing was signed, he went home. And in his upper room, with his windows open toward Jerusalem, he knelt down on his knees three times that day, and prayed and gave thanks before his God, as was his custom since early days.

The Apostle Paul was keen to remind the Thessalonians as well to never stop praying – particularly in light of the persecution they were facing.

1Thessalonians 5: 16 Rejoice always, 17 pray without ceasing, 18 in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

This is why in many churches (and it should be here at New Horizon as well) there are prayer chains. This is a network of people who pass the word around and pray for help for specific problems or provisions for particular needs.

5. But one of the reasons you and your neighbor don't have sustenance and the Spirit of God (and everything else you need) is because you don't ask.

Luke 11: 9 "So I say to you, **ask, and it will be given to you;** seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. 10 "For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. **11 "If a son asks for bread from any father among you, will he give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will he give him a serpent instead of a fish?** 12 "Or if he asks for an egg, will he offer him a scorpion? 13 "If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!"

6. Only arrogance (傲慢, 自负), thinking that if you ask something once that God is obligated to give it to you, would cause you to only pray once for something. So if you have stopped thanking God for your salvation, or if you have stopped praying for someone's salvation, or healing, examine your heart to see whether you think too much of yourself. You must be like that persistent widow. Luke 18.

Conclusion:

Someone accurately describe prayer as the breath of the soul. If you don't pray, you are dead. By praying you **show you are thankful to God for all he has already done** for you and that he is the only source of good things. By praying, you show that you know **God will provide sustenance for your body and soul (and your neighbor's as well).** You must **persistently pray.** And remember, you can only pray to God because you have access through Christ. Only the Christian's prayer has proper direction.

Brothers and Sisters in Jesus Christ:

Do you pray because you have **gratitude in your heart** for what God has done for you?

Do you pray for **God's gifts of sustenance and his Spirit** for yourself and for others? And when you receive these gifts, do you use them well – use them for the advancement of Christ's kingdom?

Do you **pray persistently to your heavenly** Father who delights to hear you ask for things?

If you do these things, then your prayer is a sweet smelling savor (馨香) to God.

Keep faithful in this! Don't let your prayer be a weak whiff (淡而无味) of perfume? A Christian without prayer is like a perfume without a scent.

Finally, if you are not a believer in the true God you dare not go to him in prayer. If you are a Muslim, or Hindu, or Buddhist you cannot pray to God and ask his good gifts. It is arrogant to do so and God will reject you. But if you first go to him and say: "I want to become your child," God will accept you. If you sincerely ask, he is bound to accept you for Christ paid for the sins of the world.
